We sought to create intra-community dialogue about sustainability

- Larger events that promote dialogue encourage more community members to become involved
- Different groups are working to accomplish the same goals; events like this allow them to connect

Event Details

The Cheshire Sustainability Fair was held at the First Congregational Church green on October 16, 2021

- Event promoted in <u>The Cheshire</u> Herald, the Record Journal, and The Cheshire Citizen
- 10 different groups participated, focusing on conservation, water and land management and protecting pollinators
- Help from over 30 total volunteers, including more than five from Cheshire High School

The Take-Away

- The fair was attended by over 150 community members of all ages
- Event, along with other sustainability measures, was discussed at local debates
- Appointment of new members to Cheshire Environment Commission
- Rejection of proposal to combine Environment and Energy Commissions, allowing more opportunities for funding
